Entert will need a great deal of help and support to make his term as Section 1 Chief a success. Let our Lodge stand behind "Our Man Ashley" in this great undertaking.






I would like to thank everyone for their support during the year and the members of the Executive Committee for doing a good job. I ask that you fulfill your Obligation; it's your honor.
