
The ceremonies for the Ordela are in good hands. Robbie Brown has had two meetings, one to hand out parts and one for

With this being our bicentennial year, we thought it only fitting to run an article on the history of our lodge.

Many Lodges have adopted the custom of first choosing their totems and then naming their Lodge in the appropriate Indian language for their totem. Totems are usually chosen to represent a bird or animal of the forest, which is the deer, but also an Indian head.


The top figure of our totem is the head of an Indian in full bonnet, which is consistent with the theme of some of our council camp and camporee emblems - a cut-out of an Indian head with full bonnet, but was later changed to two feathers to signify a brave instead of a chief. The lodge totem has more significance to it than this, however, in that the Indian pictured on the totem is Chanco, one of the unsung and truly great figures in American History. Since this Powhatan Indian brave who, tied in with early history of Surry County, the county in which our Council camp was located at the time and due to the fact that Chanco displayed additional virtues desired by every Scout, it was only logical then to name our lodge "Chanco", and let his figurehead top our emblem. Thus Lodge /483 had its totem and an appropriate Indian title, the actual name of a real Indian.

Thus on June 13, 14, and 15, 1952, at Camp Waters, Surry, Virginia, Blue Heron Lodge #349 conducted the first ordeal of Chanco Lodge #463.

COURIER AWARDED CERTIFICATE OF MERIT
