...As an Ordeal Member you were selected by your troop based on your ability to live by the scout oath and law. Brotherhood signifies your personal commitment and willingness to increase your service and leadership to the lodge and is considered sealing your bonds or beliefs in its purposes.

If you are interested in making this commitment to fulfill your obligation, you are encouraged to participate in any of the Brotherhood hikes to be held at the ordeal weekends on 21 May and 13 August, at Camp Baker at 11:30 on Saturday, September 17th or during the Fall Fellowship on 29 October at Pipsico Scout Reservation.

In addition to being an Ordeal Member for at least 10 months, you must have paid your lodge dues and be registered in scouting. Cost of Brotherhood is \$15.00 for the sash, which can be paid by filling in the brotherhood line on the 2005 Blue Heron event registration form, which is available at the scout office.

Brotherhood candidates should be in "Class A" uniform with ordeal sash, bring a pen or pencil and a pocketknife, and a 3 or 4-foot walking stick, which they are not attached to. They should also have knowledge of the pre-order ceremony, the obligation, and the song.

It happens once every two years when the Order of the Arrow holds it's National Order of the Arrow Conference at a major university. Planned and carried by youth, NOAC provides Lodge out delegates with a deeper understanding of the Oath, Law and Obligation as well as a renewed spirit, pride and enthusiasm in Scouting and the Order. NOAC will also provide you and your Lodge with new program ideas, knowledge and skills and a better understanding of how to carry out the work of the Lodge. Most of all, NOAC will provide you and your Lodge an opportunity to compete in various team and individual sports and events, share ideas, show off successes, and create meaningful relationships and memories.


