Strongest Lodge

The new ... SR-7A Lodge of the Year Award recognizes the most exceptional lodge in SR-7A. The evaluation is based on the lodge's ability to fulfill the basic purposes of the Order of the Arrow and to participate in section events. Lodges score themselves on objective criteria. The lodge which scores the most points will receive the "Strongest Lodge Award" that year, have its name places on a

circulating plaque, and receive bragging rights for the year.

How is it done?

Lodges accrue points between and during conclaves. Part I of the Strongest Lodge Award measures the strength of the lodge between conclaves. Lodges must turn in Part I to the section vice-chief no later than 8pm Friday of Conclave. Part II measures the strength of the lodge AT conclave. Lodges must turn in Part II to the section vice-chief by 6pm Saturday of Conclave.

- Contact all Colonial Virginia Council Scoutmasters to offer elections, camping and OA Troop Representative training.
- Update the Lodge Plan Book with relevant updates at least every 3 months
- > Continue to enhance participation in the Conclave in number (> 90 participants)), in event participation/leadership and in the level of spirit and encourage early registration.
- Establish sports teams for Conclave 2012 by finalizing the roster for each competition by the March 2012 LEC meeting.
- ➤ Increase brotherhood conversion from 2010 (>30%)
- Obtain Quality Lodge in 2011.
- Have at least 4 Chapters obtain Quality Chapter Award in 2011
- Post the schedules for Lodge Events on the Lodge website a minimum of 14days in advance of the event
- Actively promote NOAC 2012
- Increase visibility and awareness of the Honor Member and First Arrowman Award programs.
