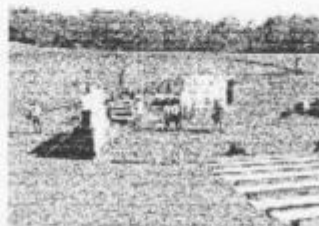


TRAINING. Here, Chris Esch and John Sgroi (left) and Roger Druin (right) teach training classes on Saturday.
