Insignia and Memorabilia of KECOUGHTAN LODGE 463

The following list of memorabilia is an attempt to record every item issued by Kecoughtan Lodge since our first brothers began their ordeal at Camp Delmont on June 6, 1951 and subsequent charter of Kecoughtan Lodge later that same year.

Every effort has been made to verify the accuracy and completeness of this list by collaborating with many long-term Scouters of Peninsula Council and Kecoughtan Lodge. In spite of this effort, mistakes may be included. If you are aware of any errors and/or omissions, please call them to my attention, so future editions may be corrected.

The format of this listing is based on the ARAPAHO II publication, which has become the standard of patch listings. The columns in the listing are as follows:

Column 1 - a series of "boxes" to conveniently check off issues as you add them to your collection.

Column 2 - is the ARAPAHO II, 1988 supplement classification.

Column 3 - NEW - The universal numbering system (ARAPAHO II) designates the lodge issues in a standardized way to aid in the communications between collectors. The letter(s) in the code designates the items into similar categories as noted below. The number(s) in the code designates the order in which similar items were issued.

A - Arrowhead-shaped
C - Chenille
F - Not fully embroidered flap
J - Jacket patch
L - Leather
M - Metal
P - Prototype
R - Round-shaped
S - Solid embroidered flap
W - Woven into the fabric
X - Odd-shaped (square, diamond, etc.)
Z - Reproductions, souvenirs, "fakes"
CM - Coffee mugs
HP - Hat pins

NOTE: Event issues are not listed in the ARAPAHO format as shown above. Instead the lodge event issues are designated according to the year in

which they were issued.

Column 4 - BACKGRND for "background" - Three letters followed by one letter. The first three letters indicate the color of the background and the fourth letter indicates the material. The color codes will be listed below. The material codes are: "S" - fully embroidered background; "T" - twill background; "F" - felt background.

Column 5 - BORDER - Again, three letters followed by one letter. The first three are for the color and the fourth letter designates the type of border (described fully in ARAPAHO II) as "C" - cut edge; "R" - rolled edge.

Column 6 - LETTER - A three letter code to designate the color of the primary lettering on the issue.
Column 7 - A brief description to further identify the issue by shape, size, quoted lettering, unique characteristics, etc. Quantity issued is noted in parenthesis.

Column 8 - The year of issue.

It should be noted that this listing is not intended to be the same, or even an extension of ARAPAHO II, which was last published in 1988. There is one quite notable difference, i.e. between S2 and S3. ARAPAHO lists the "stubby" flap as S2 when it was actually the third flap issue of Kecoughtan Lodge, so the "stubby" is therefore listed herein as the "S3" issue. The ARAPAHO

"A2" listing is also an error of misinformation, as there was actually only one green arrowhead issue. Please note also that the arrowhead-shaped neckerchief patches were classified as "X"s in ARAPAHO II and now are listed as "A"s. The "R1, R2, R3 & X6" designations in ARAPAHO II are actually 1976 ordeal and banquet event issues.

I should like to gratefully acknowledge all the Scouters and collectors who have contributed their knowledge to the accuracy and completeness of this listing. I should also like to acknowledge the publishers of ARAPAHO II for their pioneering efforts in establishing their classification of memorabilia.

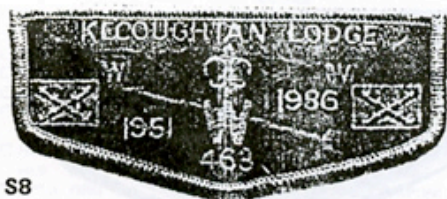

LODGE NEWS:

In the Volume 13 Number 2 issue of the SCQ it was reported that there were several council mergers and as a result of the council mergers, the Lodges would be merging as well. At the time it was not known what all the Lodge names or numbers would be. The following information about these merged Lodges is now available.

KISHKAKON LODGE 32 of the new Trails West Council was formed from the merger of Blackhawk Lodge 94 and Cahokia Lodge 126. An S1 has already been issued but lacked the fleur d'lis so another order was placed for an S2 flap that would have the fleur d'lis. The flaps will appear in the next issue of the SCQ.

GANIENKEH LODGE 181 was formed on December 16, 1990 in the new Twin Rivers Council. This was the merger of Nishca Nimat Lodge 181, Ta-Oun-Ya-Wat-Ha Lodge 268 and Thay-En-Da-Ne-Gea Lodge 418. The name for the new Lodge was submitted by Greg Newell. The name means "land of flint." The new flap design was submitted by Jake Herring. Chris Euler of Albany, New York has been elected the 1991 Lodge Chief.

NENDAWEN LODGE 618 was formed on January 1, 1991 from the merger of Kootaga Lodge 201 and Buckongehannon Lodge 527. The name means "torch carrier". The new council name is Allohak Council. The new chief is Kenny Barnhouse, the adviser is Al Billips and the staff adviser is Steve Parks. A flap has been issued.
