

### 40<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY OF KECOUGHTAN LODGE

The year 1991 will be the second consecutive year of anniversary celebrations for Kecoughtan OA members. The year 1990 was the 75th Anniversary of the Order and the year 1991 is the 40th anniversary of Kecoughtan Lodge.

The Kecoughtan anniversary year will be celebrated by a series of special acknowledgements. The new 40th anniversary logo on the top of this page of the Kryer is the first and will be in use for all the issues of the newsletter published this year. Other notices will be in the form of commemorative patches and an Anniversary Fellowship to be held in June. (See the last page of this Kryer for a patch order form.)

The Fellowship will be the highlight of our celebration. Plans call for inviting representatives of our mother (founder) lodge, Blue Heron Lodge in Tidewater Council. Representatives will also be invited from our grandmother lodge (Blue Heron's founder), which is Octorao Lodge in Chester County Council in Pennsylvania. Our sister lodge (also founded by Blue Heron), Chanco Lodge from Old Dominion Council, will also be invited. These guests and the Kecoughtan brothers will enjoy sports events, patch trading, and ceremonies.

The preparations for the Fellowship will be substantial and will involve considerable work by the Lodge. This will probably come in the form of Beaver Days at Camp Chickahominy at which time we will labor to prepare camp for the summer influx of Scouts. The actual fellowship will be in place of our normal Spring Ordeal weekend.

During the fellowship we will still conduct an Ordeal Ceremony and the candidates will labor as usual. However, the current brothers will have performed their service during the Beaver Days so the fellowship will be just that -- a time of fellowship among ourselves and our guess!

# 1990 CHRISTMAS BANQUET AND VIGIL ANNOUNCEMENTS

On December 18th, Kecoughtan conducted a major event of the 75th Anniversary year of the Order. This event, the Christmas Banquet, was attended by 185 brothers and guests who enjoyed each other, consumed good food, witnessed quality Indian dancing, and announced the Vigil Honors.

The 1990 Vigil Honor selections announced by Lodge Chief Jeff Godby, 1st Vice Chief Rob Kirkpatrick, and Past Lodge Chief Bonner Burton were as follows:

Daniel A. Raymond: This Arrowman began his Scouting in 1984. Since that time he has achieved the Arrow of Light and, in 1990, the Eagle. He was elected to OA in 1987 and attained Botherhood in 1988. Contributions to Scouting include two years on camp staff, service on the Ceremonial Team, and service as an Elangomat. Currently, he is 2nd Vice Chief of the Lodge and a member of Post 4380.

James Friesz: Jim entered Cubs in 1974, earned the Arrow of Light, and in 1983 achieved Eagle. He was elected to the OA in 1982 and reached Brotherhood in 1983. He has served on camp staff for a total of 6 years and currently is an assistant scoutmaster (Troop 13) and post committee member (Post 4380). He has served the Lodge as Membership secretary, Lodge Chief, and as Associate advisor to the Cooking and Service Committees.

Melvin Fry: Pete entered Scouting as an adult in 1966. Since then he has served eleven years as an assistant scoutmaster and four years as a scoutmaster. A member of the Lodge since 1973, he is currently the Wendamen Chapter Advisor and Associate Advisor to the Ceremonial Team. His service to youth includes over thirty-one years as a professional educator in the Virginia schools.

Kecoughtan extends appreciation to American Legion Post 368 for hosting this event, as they have done for the past four years. Thanks also to Banquet Chairman Chuck Bellinger, Jr. and his advisor, Chuck Bellinger, Sr. for making the 1990 banquet a success.

We have been fortunate over the years to have had an abundance of memorabilia to auction and good attendance at our auction. Unfortunately, supplies are drying up at a time when our camp needs help. The auction bidders, youth and adult, will be there with the dollars to bid, so we must have donated items to auction off. #### **HAVE YOU PAID YOUR 1991 DUES?**

Kecoughtan dues are \$5.00 a year. Dues go to \$6.00 a year if late. You can pay a one time fee of \$50.00 for LIFETIME membership but such membership is not transferable. Annual dues should be paid by November 30 preceding the year for which the dues are assessed. 1991 dues should have been paid by November 30, 1990. If the label on this Kryer does not have LIFE or 1991, you are delinquent and now owe \$6.00 for 1991. (Labels were printed 1/5/91.) If you were a member of Kecoughtan and did not pay 1990 dues, you should pay the delinquent dues for 1990 (\$6.00) and the 1991 dues (additional \$6.00) at the same time or pay LIFETIME dues. This is the last notice. Late dues can be paid by end of the Winter Ordeal.
