

FINAL SE-8 CONCLAVE

The final conclave held by Order of the Arrow Section SE-8 was hosted by Tutelo Lodge at Camp Powhatan, near Pulaski, VA. The dates of the event were April 16-18, 1993. The national reorganization of the BSA has resulted in elimination of some regions and sections. Our old region, the Southeast Region, is being consolidated into the new Southern Region and our old section, SE-8, is being dissolved and the seven Lodges in the section are being assigned to other sections. Kecoughtan will become a part of Section 7 in the new Southern Region. The section will be called SR-7.

A total of 59 Kecoughtan brothers attended conclave. They joined with almost 600 other Arrowmen in a campout filled with training, ceremony competition, dance competitions, games, a mini-marathon, a carnival, and lots of brotherhood. Kecoughtan was very active in this conclave.

- Keith Tollett taught a dance team orientation class and also won 1st place in the individual traditional dance competition.
- Patrick Singletary and Mike Conley, assisted by Arch Smith and Ryan Kershner, taught three classes on ceremonies.
- Matthew Elofson, Rick Elofson, John Athayde, Jason Zick, and A.J.

Cunningham participated in a short trek on the Powhatan Reservation.

The Lodge tug-of-war team placed 2nd in that competition.

The Lodge volleyball team defeated Tutelo (11-8 and 11-5) and finished in 2nd place among the seven Lodges.

The Kecoughtan soccer team defeated Chanco (4-2) and then tied Tutelo for the championship. Six attempts to break the tie failed. (Members of the team included J.O. Edelblute, Jeff Godby, Jimmy Wiley, Mike Conley, Tim Bearden, and A.J. Cunningham.) Ryan Kershner and Bill Johnson finished in 1st and 2nd places, respectively, in the mini-marathon. Ryan's time was 13.10 for the two miles.

The Kecoughtan Ceremony Team placed second in the team competition presenting the Pre-Ordeal Ceremony. Mike Conley placed 2nd as Allowat Sakima in the individual ratings. (This was his first competition.) Ryan Kershner placed 2nd as Meteu. J.O. Edelblute placed 3rd as Kichkinet.

1993 SPRING ORDEAL

Over 170 Kecoughtan brothers gathered May 21, 22, and 23, 1993 at Camp Chickahominy for the Spring 1993 Ordeal. The weather was very cooperative and the attendees enjoyed good brotherhood while they performed cheerful service for our Council's camp. Service Committee Chairman Sean Vulcan reported that tent platforms were repaired throughout the camp, tents were erected in all sites except one, bunks were put up, the spillway at the lake was cleared, and a general cleanup of the camp was accomplished. Other projects included extension of the electrical system to the front gate and initiation of the cleanup and repairs to the ranger's house. An important part of the tent process was the identification of 44 tents for repair at a subsequent Beaver Day.

As always, these accomplishments for Scouting in our Council do not come without important contributions by individual members of our Lodge. Thanks this time go out to:

- The Elangomat Committee (Rodney Beltz, Tim Walker, Chris Schilling, Kenneth Casey, Chris Beal, Anthony Kelso, David Galay, and A.J. Cunningham) for their important work with the candidates.
- The Ceremony Team that presented excellent Pre-Ordeal, Brotherhood, and two Ordeal ceremonies. The team members for the Ordeal were: John Athayde (Allowat), Dan Raymond (Meteu), Mike Conley (Nutiket), and Dan Klapperich (Kichkinet). For the Brotherhood the members were: Thomas Klevecz (Allowat), Mike Conley (Meteu), John Athayde (Nutiket), and Arch Smith (Kichkinet).

- The Kitchen Committee for keeping us well fed. Most of us do not realize that this committee works very long hours to do their job so well. Jason Ayers is the new chairman of this committee. Bill Ayers is the advisor.
- The Lodge brothers and candidates who came and performed the cheerful service to make our camp a better place for Scouting. This support also involved active participation in a patch auction to raise almost \$800 for equipment for the camp.

Everyone agreed that the 1993 Spring Ordeal was a good one. This was especially true for the 55 candidates who passed their Ordeal and the 28 brothers who sealed their membership by attaining Brotherhood. We can all look forward to a repeat opportunity at the Summer Ordeal scheduled for September 17, 18, and 19, 1993. See you there?



SR-7 CONCLAVE -- THE NEW WAY

The first SR-7 conclave was hosted by Occonechee Lodge at Camp Durant near Raleigh, North Carolina the same weekend as the SE-8 Conclave was held at Camp Powhatan (April 16-18). The SR-7 conclave was attended by over 1100 Arrowmen representing 14 Lodges. Arrowmen from Chanco, Blue Herron, Nawakwa, and Kecoughtan (all from the old SE-8) were among the participants.

This SR-7 conclave emphasized Indian culture. Events included arrowhead napping, finger weaving, and dancing. In the dance events, credit was given for authenticity and detail of costumes.

The 1994 conclave will be held at Keyauwe Lodge of Old North State Council, Greensboro, North Carolina. The dates are April 15-17, 1994. Blue Herron will host in 1996 at Camp Pipsico as part of their 50th anniversary celebration. Kecoughtan will host in the year 2003.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED OFFICER ELECTION PROCEDURE CHANGE

At the September 1993 Ordeal, Kecoughtan Lodge will vote on a change in the election procedures for Lodge and Chapter officers. The new proposal, if approved, will result in Lodge and Chapter officers being elected at the Spring Ordeal (May or June) for a one year term. Currently these officers are elected at the Summer Ordeal (September). To implement this, the officers elected at the September 1993 Ordeal will serve until Spring 1994 when the new procedure would begin (if approved by Lodge vote).










tags for sale. They earned over \$500 for Kecoughtan in the process.

- Lodge Chief Dan Raymond and Lodge Advisor Carlon Lewis were recognized by Section Chief John Boggs for their work in the Section during the last year.
- Sam Clymans, a member of the Colonial Virginia professional staff, was recognized by Boggs for his eight years as the SE-8 professional advisor.

Other activities in this conclave included a Vigil rededication ceremony, a campfire with good stories and ceremony, and a patch auction. The auction raised \$1,700 to be contributed to the memorial fund honoring Brian Gregson, past Lodge Chief of Blue Herron Lodge (Tidewater Council) and the 1993 secretary of SE-8. Brian was drowned in a surfing accident this past January.

Overall, this was a very good conclave and the Kecoughtan brothers who attended had an
