Dear Brothers,



FROM THE KRYER ADVISER

In the last issue of the Kecoughtan Kryer I mentioned my visit to the Virginia Indian Seminar in June of 1990. I also said I would write about seeing Iron Eyes Cody there. Remember he is the Native American actor who once did a TV spot for the Keep America Beautiful Campaign. He was shown as an Indian drifting alone in a canoe. As he saw how our waters were being polluted, a single tear rolled down his cheek, telling the whole story. This very powerful public service commercial still shows up on TV screens after nearly twenty years. At the seminar Cody told a story every bit as powerful as his 'tear' commercial.

At the seminar, he told those in attendance a story about how many years ago Indian youths would go away in solitude to prepare for manhood. On one such journey, an Indian youth decided to test himself against a snow capped mountain. He set off to climb the peak. When he reached the top he was sure he was on the edge of the world and that he could see forever. stood there full of himself when he heard something at his feet. Looking down he saw a snake. Before the youth could move the snake spoke, "I am about to die. It is too cold for me up here and I am freezing. There is no food

and I am starving. Put me under your shirt and take me down to the valley."

The youth said, "No, you are a rattlesnake and if I pick you up you will bite me and I will die." "Not so." said the snake. "If you do this for me I will not harm you."

This was a very persuasive snake with beautiful markings and the youth picked him up, tucked him under his shirt, and carried the snake down to the valley. There he laid the snake gently in the grass when suddenly the snake coiled and struck him in the leg. "But you promised." cried the vouth.

"You knew what I was when you picked me up," said the snake as he slithered away. Iron Eyes Cody tried to relate the story to people who are tempted by drugs. For me, the story was even more useful than that.

Trading Post News






