Summer ORDEAL a BIG Success!

The Summer Ordeal held on August 26-27, 1995, went well. It was attended by 131 brothers and 39 Ordeal candidates. The main project was to take the old Chapel down and this was accomplished quickly. This is in preparation for the new Chapel which is scheduled to be built at a joint Chanco-Kecoughtan Beaver Day November 4th. The old Chapel has a great deal of insect damage and needed to be taken down. A major surprise project arose the Friday of the Ordeal which required a quick response. The large four inch water main broke and needed quick repair. Bobby Wallace's tractor and Roy Larson's BobCat came to the rescue. The members who would have been digging for some time owe a BIG debt of gratitude to the brothers for their timely assistance.

We have made mention, in the *Kecoughtan Kryer*, of Bill Vulcan and his work at ordeals in the past. So this issue should not be any different because Bill makes it so easy. Saturday afternoon he parked his truck (actually his son Sean's truck) under a dead tree near the trading post. As soon as he left the truck, the ever observant Al Klapperich pointed

out the tree to Bill. Bill was not impressed. Seconds later a major branch fell from the tree striking the truck in the bed area. Fortunately, the damage was slight, but it was a real scare for all those standing near it. It was especially scary for Bill who spent the afternoon trying to figure how he was going to explain it to his son.

Chanco had their Ordeal August 19-10, 1995, and they had accomplished much of the work that needed to be done to close camp. Prior to the Ordeal and prior to the expected arrival of Hurricane Flex several local troops came to camp and put the majority of the tents away. Eighty-five Chanco brothers and twenty-one ordeal candidates finished the task. Kecoughtan Lodge completed the bunk storage, improvement of the ceremonial ring, removal of several dead trees, and pool cleaning. The camp was fortunate to have escaped storm damage, but much work has put the camp in good condition for the winter.

FROM THE EDITOR



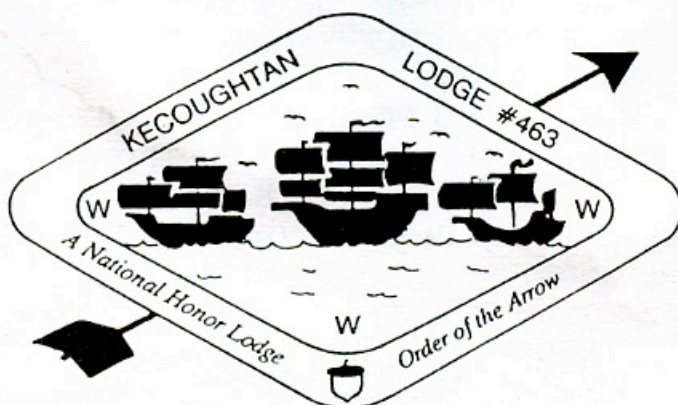
Brothers,

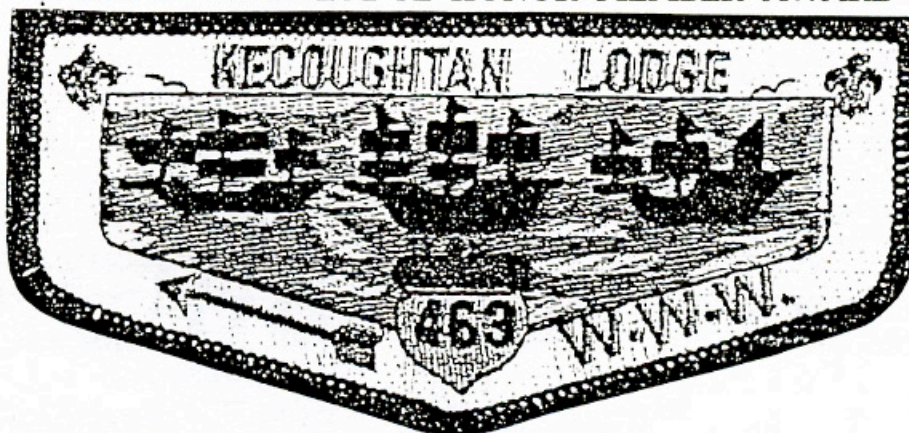
