### ***1993 NATIONAL OFFICERS ELECTED***

Section chiefs from across the nation gathered in Dallas on Dec 26-29 for an Assembly of Chiefs to elect national and regional officers for 1993. The theme was to begin a new voyage in "Conquest of Quality" and focused improved support for lodge operations in the following areas: training, shows, activities, special events, Native American events and ceremony events.

Brian Beaverstock, an Eagle Scout and Vigil Honor member of Tisquantum Lodge #164, Old Colony Council #249, was elected 1993 National Chief of the Order of the Arrow. He has served as section chief for NE-1B for the past three years and was lodge chief and lodge vice chief.

Dameon Hutto, section chief of S-9, was elected National Vice Chief of the Order of the Arrow. Prior to being section chief, he was a lodge chief and section secretary. He is an Eagle Scout and Vigil Honor member of Tiak Lodge #404, Pine Burr Council #304.

Mike Salazar, an Eagle Scout and Vigil Honor member of W-Hi-Nasa Lodge #111, Middle Tennessee Council #560, is the Southern Region Chief for 1993. He

has served the past two years as section chief of SE-6.
