

1995 SPRING INDUCTION

The Spring Induction was held on 24-26 March and we had over 100 brothers and candidates attend. 1995 HISTORIC PATCH SET

To commemorate the history of this Lodge's namesake, a three-patch set was developed by Dewitt Holland. The Spring Induction patch depicts Chanco being told of the attack on the English settlers by his older brother. The Fall Induction patch depicts Chanco telling Mr Pace that night of the upcoming massacre. The Christmas Banquet patch depicts Mr Pace arriving by boat from across the James River that night to warn the settlers at the Jamestown fort.

1995 SR-7 SECTION CONCLAVE WAS THE MOST!

This year's conclave was hosted by Nayawin Rar Lodge #296 on 21-23 April at Camp Tuscarora, near Newton Grove, North Carolina. The Lodge had 54 brothers attend and each person is to be commended for showing the rest of the Lodges in the Section that Chanco Lodge was alive and strong! - 3. Conducts registration at all Lodge functions.
- 4. Handles Lodge corrrespondence and sends out notices of meetings to members and advisors.
- 5. Promotes the correct wearing of the Scout uniform by personal example.

LODGE TREASURER DUTIES

- Maintains patch box materials and a current inventory list.
- 2. Maintains current records of all restricted purchases.
- Maintains Lodge financial records with the Council office personnel.
- 4. Develops the operating budget for the Lodge year.
- 5. Promotes the correct wearing of the Scout uniform by personal example.

- 1. Establish a communications sytem to contact members.
- Assist in camping promotion and unit elections.
- Establish district service projects.
