
After reregistration we will have about 705 current dues paying members.

#### Letter from the Adviser:




#### **ENGRAVING COMMITTEE:**



### OA MEMBERS MUST BE REGISTERED WITH THE LOCAL COUNCIL

To become and remain a member of an Order of the Arrow lodge, it is necessary for a Scout or Scouter to be registered with the local council. Therefore, Wahunsenakah Lodge #333 members must be registered in a Unit, District, or Council position with the Colonial Virginia Council. During March 1996, the Wahunsenakah Lodge roster will be checked against the Colonial Virginia Council membership list. Members shown on our lodge roster and who are not registered with the Colonial Virginia Council will be removed from the OA roster without additional notification. It is the responsibility of each OA member to make sure that he/she is properly registered with the council.
