List all of the OA positions which this individual has held or currently holds, (i.e., chapter/Lodge Officer, Chapter/Lodge Committee Chairman or Associate Chairman, Chapter/Lodge Adviser or Associate Adviser, etc.) If no positions were held, leave blank. Trading Post Action

1. Financial report for the 1996 Ordeal:

beginning inventory of supplies was worth	\$5,177.02
expenses for additional supplies were	\$9,304.82
receipts from cash sales were	\$6,226.43
receipts from lodge vouchers were	\$2,144.49
receipts from Scout Shop sales were	\$ 170.00
ending inventory of supplies was worth	\$9,696.90

Net **PROFIT** for the lodge was \$3,755.98

2. Receipts from the Spring Ordeal Lodge Auction were \$634.00. All proceeds were deposited in the lodge account for camp maintenance & camperships.

3. About 1000 of the "charter" flaps have been sold. Current restrictions will remain in effect until Saturday afternoon of the summer ordeal. At that time, an amount of flaps will be set aside for new members. Other members may then purchase 3 additional flaps until the supply is exhausted.

4. All 1200 conclave flaps were sold out by midday Saturday of the spring ordeal.

5. Only 400 of the Kecoughtan 45th anniversary flaps remain. Restrictions have been amended to allow the purchase of 3 additional flaps by former Kecoughtan members. Only 140 of the regular issue (ordeal & brotherhood) Kecoughtan flaps remain, and will be sold on a first-come basis, without requiring service hours, to former Kecoughtan members.

6. A survey was taken at the spring ordeal of 88 brothers, with an even youth/adult distribution, regarding what kinds of lodge items they would like to have available. The results:

lodge camps for approx. \$7.50 Yes-73 No-15 83% in favor
polo shirt for approx. \$16 Yes-50 No-36 58% in favor
hatpin-flap shape for \$2-2.50 Yes-70 No-17 80% in favor
hatpin-duck shape for \$2-2.50 Yes-69 No-18 79% in favor
lodge backpatch for about \$10 Yes-57 No-29 66% in favor
lodge neckerchief for about \$10 Yes-57 No-29 66% in favor
other requests: mugs Yes-5 No-0

It would appear there is enough demand to justify providing all of the above items to lodge members. Suggestion: the executive committee approve the concept of providing the above items so that designs and estimates may be solicited by the trading post committee for final approval by the executive committee.

6. We need designs for Christmas banquet patches submitted as before the August ordeal. Submit designs to trading post.

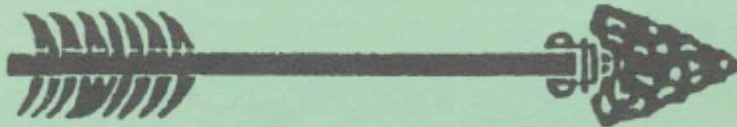
