
OA and the 1997 JAMBOREE

The Order of the Arrow will play an extremely active role in the 1997 National Boy Scout jamboree. At the Jamboree, the OA will be responsible for the following programs:

- 1. OA Service Corps- 150 OA youth members needed to provide cheerful service at the Jamboree as aids, honor guards, runners, assisting in arena shows, ushers, and a variety of other assignments at the Jamboree.
- 2. The Outdoor Skills Place Approximately 60 Arrowmen on staff providing Scouts the opportunity to test their camping and outdoor skills in a model campsite.
- 3. OA Indian Village -Approximately 60 Arrowmen show casing the American Indian culture and performing nightly.
- 4.Odyssey of the L a w Approximately 125 Arrrowmen introducing moral values and character issues which are at the heart of the Scout law through an interactive entertainment educational event.
- 5. OA Arena Show- Approximately 18,000 Arrowmen will gather at a Saturday evening arena show to hear from National Officers.

To serve on the OA Service Corps, a youth must be 16 years of age by July 1 and not 21 by August 31, 1997. Your participation must be approved by your parents, legal guardian, Lodge Adviser and council Scout executive.
