

- Financial report for the 1997 Winter Ordeal:
   beginning inventory of supplies was worth \$7,340.70
   expenses for additional supplies were \$1,614.50
   receipts from cash sales were \$4,742.88
   receipts from lodge vouchers were \$2,249.30
   receipts from Scout Shop sales were \$132.00
   ending inventory of supplies was worth \$4,043.21
   Net PROFIT for the lodge was \$2,425.34
- With the exception of the Kecoughtan 45th Anniv. flap and the Piankatank Chapter backpatch, all Chanco and Kecoughtan items have now been sold.
- Receipts from the Winter Ordeal Lodge Auction were \$706.50. All proceeds were deposited
  in the lodge account for camp maintenance & camperships, except for \$80.00 which was returned to Mrs. Tudder for Bailey's prior donations.
- 4. Restrictions on "charter" flaps were lifted again on Saturday afternoon of the winter ordeal, allowing members to purchase 3 additional flaps.
- Restrictions on Kecoughtan 45th anniversary flaps were lifted on Saturday afternoon of the winter ordeal, allowing former Kecoughtan members to purchase 3 additional flaps.
- Even though there has been ample support for additional lodge paraphernalia, no designs or suggestions have been received for lodge hatpin, backpatch or neckerchief.




