INSTRUCTIONS FOR VIGIL HONOR NOMINATION FORM

- 1. Provide nominee's name
- 2. List nominees' date of birth (if known)
- 3. List Ordeal date (if Known)
- 4. List Brotherhood date (if Known). Nominee must have received Brotherhood at least two years prior to September 30th of the Nomination year. (i.e. the 1997 nominee must have received Brotherhood no later than September 30, 1995.)
- 5. Give the nominee's current primary registered Scouting position.
- 6. List all the OA positions which the individual has held or currently holds, (i.e. chapter/Lodge Officer, Chapter Committee Chairman or Associate Chairman, Chapter/Lodge Adviser or Associate Adviser, etc.) If no positions were held, leave blank. Chapter/Lodge positions are not mandatory for Vigil Honor selection.
- 7. List all other Scouting positions previously held or currently holding excluding the positions listed in (5) & (6) above.
- 8. List all Scouting awards received (i.e., Eagle Scout, OA 75th Anniversary Award, District Award of Merit, Silver Beaver, Woodbadge Beads, etc.)
- 9. Thoroughly list the qualifications of the nominee to receive the Vigil Honor as outlined in the OA Handbook. Primary attention should be given to the Lodge, Chapter, Unit, camp in cheerful service camp promotion, and membership. Use extra as necessary.
- 10. List any other service that should be considered in evaluating the nominee.
- 11. List your phone number, the current date, and sigh the nomination form.
- 12. Send to Lodge Adviser Carlon Lewis, at 120 Sarboard Circle, Newport News, VA 23602 by August 7, 1997.


back tire. Brothers should take note of this and make an effort to keep vehicles out of camp that are not being used for camp projects.

The question that many Arrowmen have is "What Section am I in?" Conclave will different for everyone next year as members of our Section will be divided into three different Conclaves. Here is the breakdown of the new alignment of lodges that were in old Section 7.

Section 5 - Itibapishe Iti Hollo, Catawba, Eswau Section 7A - Nawakwa, Wahunsenakah, Blue Heron Section 7B - Tsiotsi Tsogalii, Occoneechee, Croatan, Wahisa, Nayawin Rar, Klahican

These changes took effect immediate following the Conclave. This was the final SR-7 Cardinal Conclave and will be a memorable event if for no other reason it had the largest attendance of any Section event and will there is some belief that this one will be the biggest one for some time.

SR-7B OFFICERS

Group payments by a unit are acceptable provided a completed registration form for each person is attached to the payment. Summer camp tents will probably not be available, so bring your own tent.

Deadline for regular registration is Saturday, August 16, 1997. A late fee of \$5.00 will be charged for registrations received between Saturday, August 16, 1997 and Wednesday, August 20, 1997. No registrations will be accepted unless received (with payment) in the Colonial Virginia Council Service Center by 5:00 pm on Wednesday, August 20, 1997. Telephone reservations will not be accepted.

Request for refunds must be received in the Colonial Virginia Council Service Center by 5:00 pm on Wednesday, August 20, 1997. There will be no refunds given if requested after this date.

If you are under 18 years of age, please have a parent or guardian read and sign the following authorization.

I hereby authorize the bearer of this form to seek and obtain medical care for my son in the event of illness or injury during the conduction of the Order of the Arrow activities at Camp Chickahominy. Drivers must be 18 years of age and must have a valid state drivers license. Uniforms are required for Saturday night dinner, ceremonies, and for the Sunday morning business meetings.
