

The 1998 National Order of the Arrow Conference is scheduled for August 2nd through the 6th, 1998 at the University of Iowa, Ames IA. The national fee is \$205 for youth (OA members under 21), and \$245 for adults (the rest of us). Even though the Lodge is still working out travel plans, it is time to get your name in the hat to go. It is expected that the total registration (National Fee + Lodge Transportation) will be in the neighborhood of \$400 for youth, and \$435 for adults.

Since we have not received any information, other than the National Fee, we do not know what registration restrictions will be placed on us other than that a 2:1 ratio of youth to adults, will be enforced.


