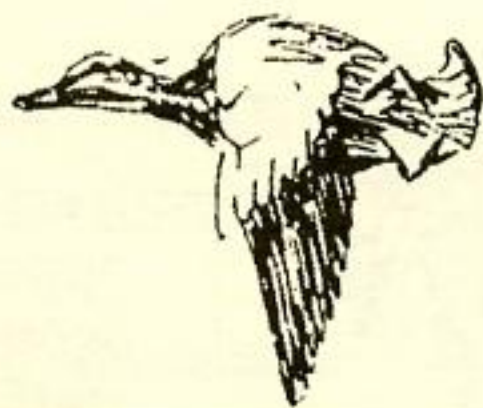

## 1998 National Order of the Arrow Conference

The 1998 National Order of the Arrow Conference is scheduled for August 2nd through the 6th, 1998 at the University of Iowa, Ames IA. The national fee is \$205 for youth (OA members under 21), and \$245 for adults (the rest of us). Even though the Lodge is still working out travel plans, it is time to get your name in the hat to go. It is expected that the total registration (National Fee + Lodge Transportation) will be in the neighborhood of \$400 for youth, and \$435 for adults.

Since we have not received any information, other than the National Fee, we do not know what registration restrictions will be placed on us other than that a 2:1 ratio of youth to adults, will be enforced.

To secure a place in the Lodge Contingent, fill out the information below, and submit to the Council Office No Later Than Saturday, January 17, 1998 with a \$50.00 deposit. Registrations will be taken on a first come, first served basis (two categories, < 21 and >21). If for any reason, we have to make a cut on participants, the deposit will be fully refunded.

Final Registration Fee amounts, and payment schedule will be forwarded to those submitting this reservation form. Act now, time will definitely slip up on you if you don't.

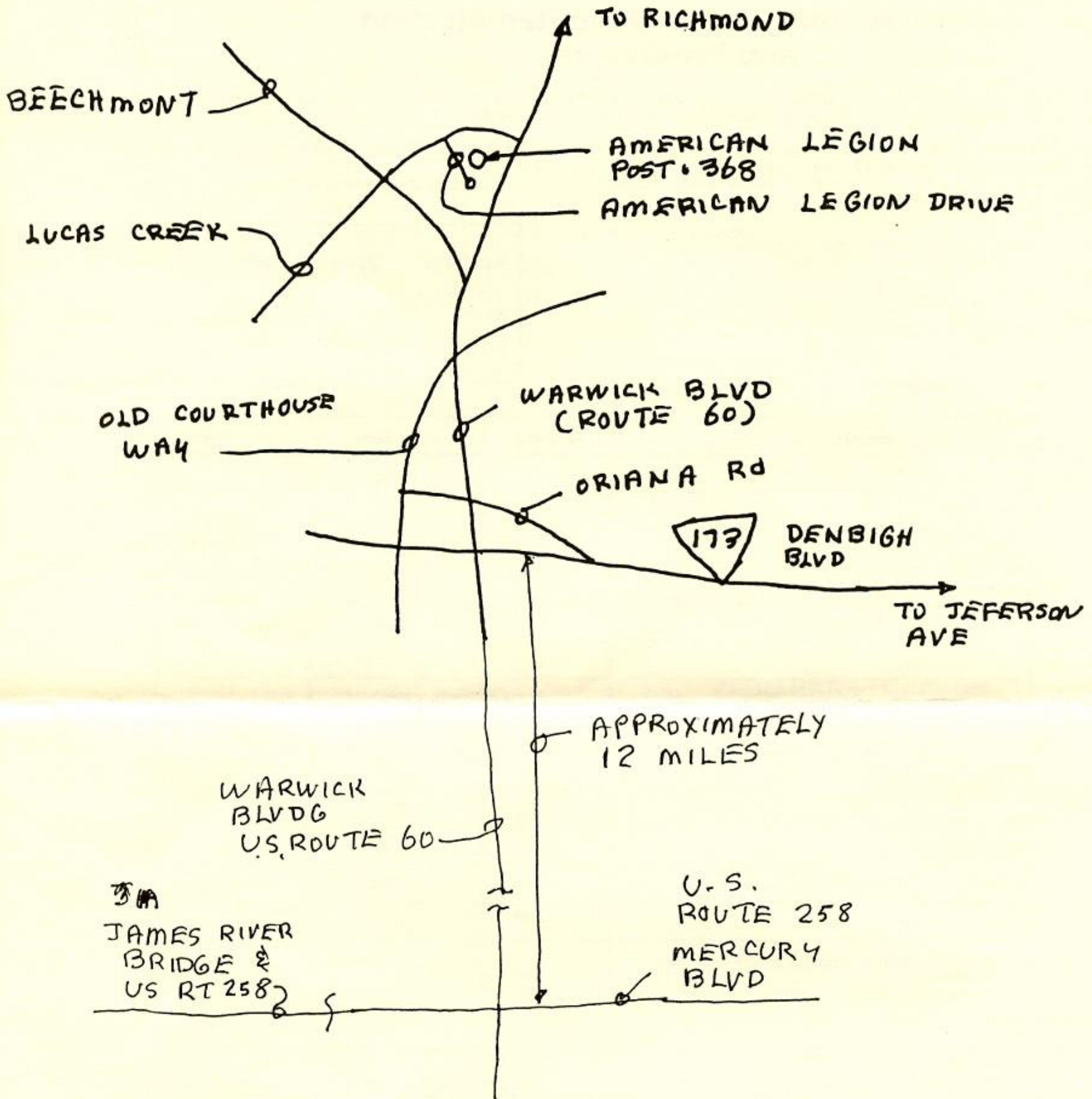
