Bound in Brotherhood, Led by the Spirit 2000 National Order of the Arrow Conference

Twenty members of Wahunsenakah Lodge #333 gathered at the Newport News Scout Office early on Saturday, July 29, 2000 to load up in two vans to head to Knoxville, Tennessee for the 2000 National Order of the Arrow Conference. This year's theme was "Bound in Brotherhood, Led by the Spirit" and 7,000 Arrowmen from around the country gathered to spend six days together on the campus of the University of Tennessee. In addition to the members of our contingent, Wahunsenakah Lodge also had several Brothers attending NOAC on staff.

Once at NOAC, the lodge checked-in and moved into their dorm building for the week. Region gatherings occupied the first evening, with the opening show not occurring until the second evening. The opening show was outstanding as we were welcomed by the National Officers of the Order of the Arrow. The History and Awards show related the history of the early Order of the Arrow created in 1915 to today, with the highlights being the presentation of the Distinguished Service Awards and the Red Arrow Award. Chief Scout Executive Roy Williams also spoke, challenging Arrowmen with his words. The Indian Dance Show was outstanding. The winners in each category were unbelievable. Our lodge had two dancers who competed at NOAC -- Patrick Kitterlin and Nate Brown. Although they did not win, they did do a great job and are already making plans for 2002. The last evening at NOAC was spent at the Theme Show, which related the theme of the conference in a new way and left everyone thinking about it.

Our lodge also participated in the usual Basketball, Volleyball, and Soccer competitions. Our ceremonies team competed in the Pre-Ordeal Ceremony Competition with a team made up of Matt Singletary, Steve Paris, Jonathan Duey, and Greg Johnson. Matt Singletary and Jonathan Duey also competed in the Vigil Honor Ceremony Competition.

Members spent the balance of their time at NOAC attending training classes, trading patches, and making new friends from around the nation. PAY 2001 Lodge Dues Now!

Make sure to pay your 2001 Lodge Dues to remain a member of the Order of the Arrow. Check the mailing label on this newsletter. If the upper right hand corner does not have a date of 2001 or later, then you should pay your 2001 Wahunsenakah Lodge dues November 30, 2000. If you pay by November 30, 2000, the dues are \$7.00. If you wait and pay your dues after November 30, 2000, the price increases to \$8.00. Remember: To be an Honor Member for the year 2000, you must pay the 2001 Lodge dues on time (by November 30, 2000). In addition, for all Arrowmen who pay their dues by November 30, 2000, \$1.00 of their dues is credited to their Chapter's account funds. If you pay you dues later, not only do you have to pay \$1.00 extra, but your chapter does not receive \$1.00 of your dues as well. 2000 SUMMER ORDEAL

Wahunsenakah Lodge #333 gathered for its final Ordeal of the 20th Century the weekend of August 25-27, 2000 at Camp Chickahominy. In many respects, the Ordeal was small, most obviously because of the small number of Ordeal and Brotherhood candidates present at the Ordeal. While the small numbers helped may have the Elangomat Committee and the Cooking Committee with less work to do, the Service Committee certainly did not take any time off. In addition to the usual Summer Ordeal ritual of taking down Camp tents, Summer cots, mattresses, and storing them for the winter, the Ordeal also had two special service projects. First, the main Campfire Ring had clans working on the new bench seating in the ring that began back in June at a Beaver Day. The project, when completed, will put bench seating in the main Campfire Ring, similar to that at the Ordeal and Brotherhood Order of the Arrow Fire Rings. Secondly, the Ceremonies Committee began construction of a storage shed near the Brotherhood Fire Ring. The shed was almost completed at the Ordeal, and the remaining work will be completed soon after. The shed can be used for storage between Ordeals.

From Interstate 64: Exit on US Route 17 towards Yorktown. Go approximately 0.6 miles. Turn right onto Harpersville Road. Take Harpersville Road approximately 0.4 miles. Chestnut Memorial United Methodist Church will be on the left side.

From the Yorktown Bridge: Take US Route 17 from the Yorktown Bridge towards Newport News. Turn left onto Harpersville Road. Take Harpersville Road approximately 0.4 miles. Chestnut Memorial United Methodist Church will be on the left side.

Wahunsenakah Lodge has a dues structure of \$7.00 per year when the dues are paid on time (November 30 of the year preceding the year for which the dues are assessed). A late fee of \$1.00 is assessed if the dues are not paid by November 30. Check the mailing label. If the upper right hand corner does not have 2001 or later, you should pay 2001 Wahunsenakah Lodge dues by November 30, 2000. An Arrowman who was previously a member of the Wahunsenakah Lodge and did not pay 2000 dues should pay the delinquent dues for 2000 (\$8.00) and the 2001 dues (additional \$7.00 if paid by November 30, 2000 or additional \$8.00 if paid after November 30, 2000) at the same time. To be an Honor Member for the year 2000, you must pay your 2001 dues by November 30, 2000.
