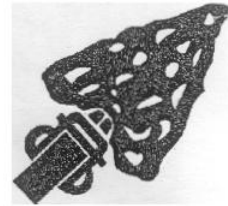

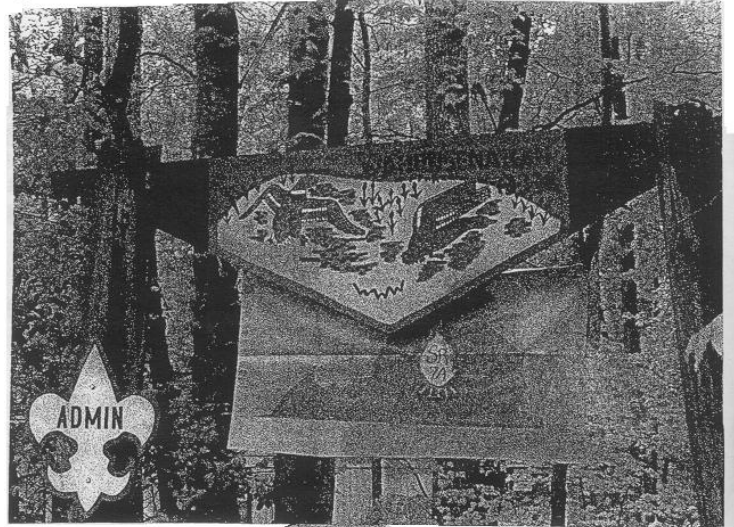


## Southern Region Section SR-7A CONCLAVE 2003

If your entire troop cannot come, then come as an individual Scout. (Provisional).

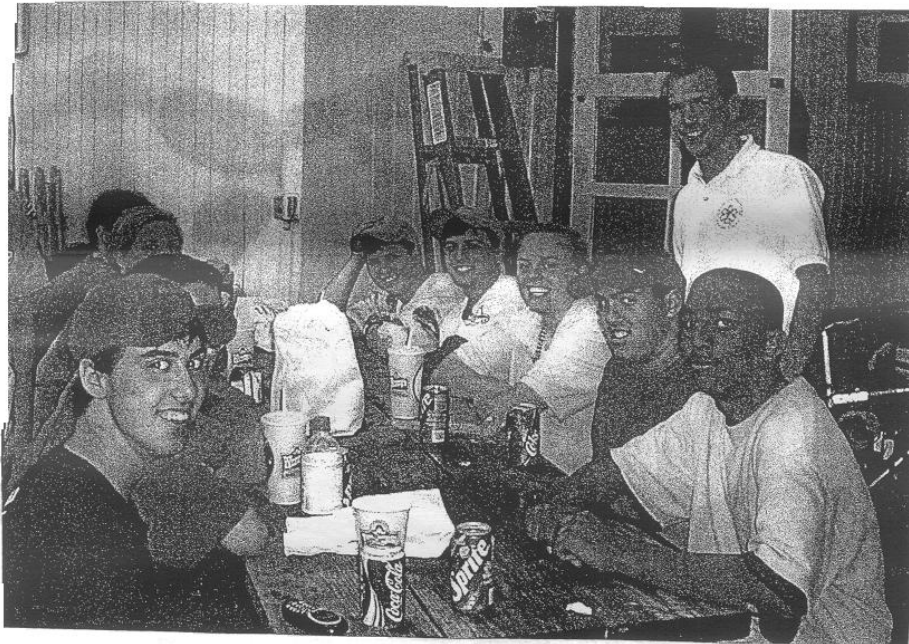

Now it was time to watch our brothers who took the brotherhood test, to learn more about our order and take the test of brotherhood through the brotherhood ceremony.

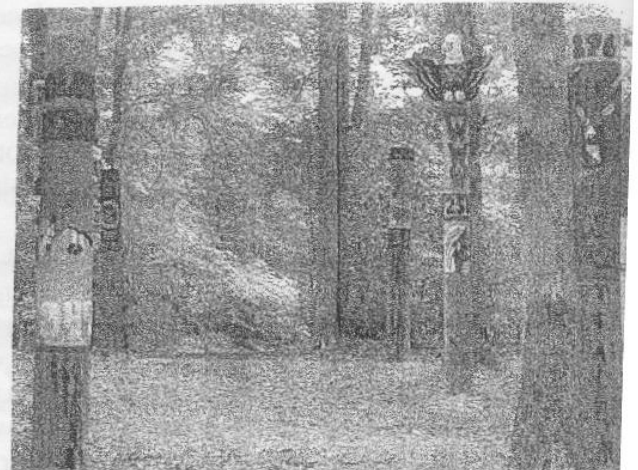
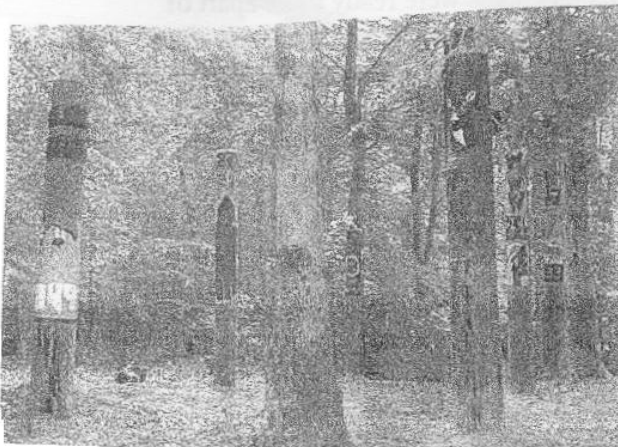
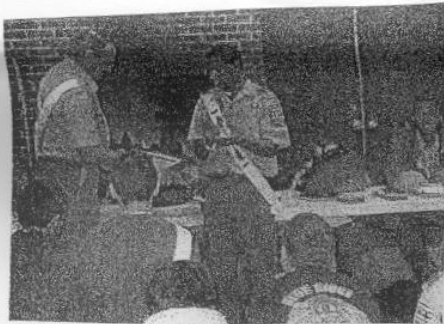
