The next morning everyone went to breakfast and headed down to the chapel area for the last chapel service at camp. God makes us all special and remember, God does not make Junk.





Lodge Fall Fellowship Location and Cost Changed


The 2004 Fall Fellowship will be held at Camp Rudolth, 19320 Darling Dr., Yale, Va. from October 29, 2004 to October 31, 2004. Participants will be staying in heated and air conditioned dorms. Bunk beds are provided. Participants are required to bring their own sheets, blankets, and/or sleeping bag. All meals will be prepared and served by the Camp Staff. Therefore, the Lodge regular kitchen crew will not have to work in the kitchen and can enjoy the Fellowship. The cost that the Lodge is paying for this service has risen to \$35.00 (as approved by the Lodge at the September business meeting). Therefore, the event fee (if paid on time) is \$35.00 for each participant. Additional fees (as shown on the registration form) are required for late registration.

Brothers who have pre-registered will be required to pay an additional fee equal to the difference between their original payment and the new attendance fee. 

Go 3.2 miles.
Continue on Suffolk Northern Bypass —go 6.6 miles.
Continue on Northern Bypass- go 2.0 miles.
Bear Right on Holland Road- go 8.3 miles.
Continue on US-58 West- go 29.2 miles.
Turn Right on Three Creeks Road- go 5.9 miles.

Turn left on Winston Churchill Drive - go 1.9 miles. Continue on Oaklawn Blvd./winston Churchill Drive - g0 0.1 mile. Continue on Oaklawn Blvd - go 0.2 miles. Continue on Woodlawn Street - go 1.1 miles. Continue on Oaklawn Blvd - go 0.3 miles. Bear right to take I-295 South towards Rocky Mt. NC. - go 9.0 miles.
