We will remember this banquet as a great way to end the year. Thanks to our brothers from across the river in Courtland, Virginia.



























































## Order of the Arrow Wahunsenakah Lodge #333 Brotherhood Evaluation Requirements

Know the Obligation and the Order of the Arrow song, both of which appear below.

- 2. Know the Admonition, the Sign of Ordeal Membership, and the Handelasp. (If you do not remember them, ask a Brotherhood member either before or at the event you choose to be evaluated for Brotherhood.)
- Remain registered in Scouting and, during a period of at least 10 months after undergoing your Ordeal, strive to fulfill you obligation by continuing and expanding your services to your own unit.
- 4. Remain registered in the Order of the Arrow and keep your dues paid. Be aware that acceptance of Brotherhood membership involves an obligation to the Wahunsenakah Lodge and, therefore, develop a concrete idea of how you plan to fulfill this obligation.
- 5. If, after at least 10 months since undergoing your Ordeal, you feel that you are meeting all of the above requirements and earnestly feel that you are prepared for the Brotherhood, you must either explain the following to the Lodge Brother who evaluates you or you must write a letter to the Lodge Membership Secretary in which you:
  - Explain what you think the Obligation means;
  - Describe how you have been fulfilling this Obligation in your Troop and in your daily life, and how you have used your understanding of the traditions of the Ordeal to aid you in your service.
  - Describe the specific plans you have for rendering service to the Wahunsenakah Lodge in fulfillment of the new pledge you expect to take.

The above described letter should accompany your reservation and fees for the Ordeal weekend at which you wish to take your Brotherhood test and accept the additional obligation of the Brotherhood.





There will be no refunds issued if Everyone who attends must register and pay the event fee. Group payments by a unit are acceptable providing a completed registration form for each person is attached to the payment. notification is received after that time and date. No fees will be transferred unless notification is received at the Scout Service Center by noon the day before the event starts.

- Submit the Brotherhood fee only if you have been an Ordeal member for 10 months or longer and you intend to seal your membership in the Order by obtaining Brotherhood.

3 - No registrations will be accepted after 5:00 PM on the Wednesday before the start of the event. Telephone registrations will not be accepted

4 - Uniforms are required for ceremonies, Saturday night dinner, and Sunday morning breakfast and business meetings.

Wahunsenakah #333 Lodge Annual Dues for 2004 are Delinquent 12/5/03

Wahunsenakah Lodge has a dues structure of \$7.00 per year when the dues are paid on time (November 30 of the year preceding the year for which the dues are assessed). A late fee of \$1.00 is assessed if the dues are not paid by November 30. Check the mailing label. The 2004 Wahunsenakah dues should have been paid by November 30, 2003. If the upper right hand corner does not have 2004 or later, you are delinquent and should pay the 2004 dues immediately. An Arrowman who was previously a member of the Wahunsenakah Lodge and did not pay 2003 dues should pay the delinquent dues for 2003 (\$8.00) and the delinquent dues for 2004 (additional \$8.00) at the same time. 
