


Wahunsenakah Lodge #333 Summer Ordeal Inducts 36 New Members into our Lodge and 12 New Brotherhood Members.



Our chapter will be helping with the James River District Fall Camporee on October 21 thru 23, 2005, at Camp Pipsico Scout Reservation, Camp Kiwanis in Surry Va. If your troop would like to do a troop unit elections at the camporee, then please email me and will try to get it set up for your troop. I have not heard if there will be a callout ceremony at the Saturday night campfire. Also on the third Thursday of each Month, we'll be meeting at the Warwick Moose Lodge for our Kiskiack Chapter Meeting from 6:30 until 7 PM. To get to the Moose Lodge, turn off of Warwick Boulevard onto Turlington Road. Follow Turlington Road and then turn right on Warwick Moose Lane. Follow this road on past the ball fields and you will see the main building of the Moose Lodge. We meet on the far side of the building. We talk about chapter business, and then we have Snacks or Pizza. The chapter needs all James River District (Newport News) help, We need a design for a Chapter Patch.

Last, I want to talk about our Kiskiack Chapter Goals, Here they are for those who do not know what they are.

- 3. Offer OA elections to all Troops in the James River
 - a. We need scouts to perform elections for different troops. It isn't that difficult of a task.
- 4. Have all new Chapter Officers attended next Lodge Leadership Development Conference (LLDC)
- 5. Increase participation of OA Representatives
 - a. See above
- 6. Identify and recruit for all Chapter leadership positions
- 7. Identify and recruit participants for One Day of Service
 - a. We need this done by November 12/19. It shouldn't be that hard if we get more scouts and it is service to the community, part if the ideals of the OA.
- 8. Support all Lodge Goals below.

'05 – '06 GOALS

- 1. 20% increase in attendance at Lodge Functions
 - a. We need inactive people to begin attending. If you have people who are in the OA but inactive, promote it in your Troop. To assist in this we need more OA Representatives to go to the Troops and announce upcoming events and remind them of deadlines and due dates. In all, promote Lodge functions and the Order of the Arrow.
- 2. Increase Brotherhood Conversion
 - a. You are eligible for Brotherhood if you have been an Ordeal member for ten months. The fee for Brotherhood is twenty-five dollars and you simply have to be evaluated where you will need to review the Obligation, song, sign, and motto.
- 3. Achieve Quality Lodge
- 4. Provide Junior Leader Training

- a. In order for this to happen, we need a chairman and a committee. This is very serious, we need someone who will do this, do it right, and have the time and dedication for it.
- 5. Do a Lodge Fundraiser
- 6. Increase participation of Troop/Team/OA Representatives
 - a. Once again, being an OA representative is simple, simply go to Chapter meetings, take notes, and then report it to your troop. This is an easy job that gets a lot done and is very useful, please, do it yourself if you are the only active OA member in the troop or promote it to others. See your Scoutmaster.
- 7. Man all committees to run at the best of their abilities
 - a. If you are part of a committee then please continue to do your best work. If not, we have several different committees available for you to work on.
- 8. Every chapter to provide Chapter Goals by the August Business meeting
- 9. Each Lodge committee should demonstrate improvement within the next year.

Well we have our work cut out for us and we need the help from each troop in the district and all members of the chapter. See you at the fall fellowship(get your form in before Oct, 15th) and at the next chapter meeting on October 20th,2005. In brotherhood we keep as a chapter



Purpose of Order of the Arrow

The purpose of the Order of the Arrow is fourfold:

To recognize those Scout campers who best exemplify the Scout Oath and Law in their daily lives

- 1 To develop and maintain camping traditions and spirit
- 2. To promote Scout camping
- To crystallize the Scout habit of helpfulness into a life purpose of leadership in cheerful service to others

History

The Order of the Arrow (OA) was founded by Dr. E. Urner Goodman and Carroll A. Edson in 1915 at the Treasure Island Camp of the Philadelphia Council, Boy Scouts of America. It became an official program experiment in 1922 and was approved as part of the Scouting program in 1934. In 1948, the OA was recognized as the BSA's national brotherhood of honor campers and became an official part of the national camping program of the Boy Scouts of America. Today, the OA is recognized as Scouting's National Honor Society.

Membership

The OA has more than 183,000 members in lodges affiliated with more than 300 BSA local councils.

Eligibility

To become a member, a youth must be a registered member of a Boy Scout troop or Varsity Scout team and hold First Class rank. The youth must have experienced 15 days and nights of camping during the two years before his election. The 15 days and nights must include one, but no more than one, long-term camp consisting of six consecutive days and five nights of resident camping, approved and under the auspices and standards of the Boy Scouts of America. The balance of the camping must be overnight, weekend, or other short-term camps. Scouts

are elected to the Order by their fellow troop or Varsity team members, following approval by the Scoutmaster or Varsity Scout Coach.

Induction

The Ordeal induction ceremony is often conducted at Scout camp and is the first step toward full membership. During the experience, candidates maintain complete silence, receive small amounts of food, work on camp improvement projects, and are required to sleep alone, apart from other campers, which teaches significant values.

Brotherhood Membership

After 10 months of service and fulfilling certain requirements, a member may take part in the Brotherhood ceremony, which places further emphasis on the ideals of Scouting and the Order. Completion of this ceremony signifies full membership in the OA.

Vigil Honor

After two years of service as a Brotherhood member and with the approval of the national Order of the Arrow Committee, a Scout or Scouter may be recognized with the Vigil Honor for outstanding service to Scouting, his lodge, and the community. This honor is bestowed by special selection and is limited to one person for every 50 members registered with the lodge each year.

Lodges

Each Order of the Arrow lodge is granted a charter from the National Council, BSA, upon annual application by the local council. The OA lodge helps the local council provide a quality Scouting program through recognition of Scouting spirit and performance, development of youth leadership and service, promotion of Scout camping and outdoor programs, and enhancement of membership tenure.



Brotherhood Evaluation Requirements

- 1. Know the Obligation and the Order of the Arrow song, both of which appear below.
- 2. Know the Admonition, the Sign of Ordeal Membership, and the Handclasp. (If you do not remember them, ask a Brotherhood member either before or at the event you choose to be evaluated for Brotherhood.)
- 3. Remain registered in Scouting and, during a period of at least 10 months after undergoing your Ordeal, strive to fulfill you obligation by continuing and expanding your services to your own unit.
- 4. Remain registered in the Order of the Arrow and keep your dues paid. Be aware that acceptance of Brotherhood membership involves an obligation to the Wahunsenakah Lodge and, therefore, develop a concrete idea of how you plan to fulfill this obligation.
- 5. If, after at least 10 months since undergoing your Ordeal, you feel that you are meeting all of the above requirements and earnestly feel that you are prepared for the Brotherhood, you must either explain the following to the Lodge Brother who evaluates you or you must write a letter to the Lodge Membership Secretary in which you:
- Explain what you think the Obligation means;
- Describe how you have been fulfilling this Obligation in your Troop and in your daily life, and how you have used your understanding of the traditions of the Ordeal to aid you in your service.
- Describe the specific plans you have for rendering service to the Wahunsenakah Lodge in fulfillment of the new pledge you expect to take.

The above described letter should accompany your reservation and fees for the Fall Fellowship Weekend at

which you wish to take your Brotherhood test Saturday October 29th 2005 and accept the additional obligation of the

Brotherhood.

The Obligation (Words by E. Urner Goodman)

I do hereby promise, on my honor as a Firm bound in Brotherhood, gather the Scout that I will always and faithfully clan. That cheerful service brings to fellow observe and preserve the traditions of the man. Circle our council fire. Weld tightly Order of the Arrow, Wimachtendienk, every link, that binds us in Brotherhood, Wingolauchsik, Witahemui. I will always Wimachtendienk. regard the ties of Brotherhood as lasting and will seek to preserve a cheerful spirit, even in the midst of irksome task and weighty responsibilities, and will endeavor, so far as in my power lies, to be unselfish in service and devotion to the welfare of others.

New First Class Requirements

Beginning January 1, 2006, an additional requirement will be added to the requirements for First Class rank in Boy Scouting. Scouts beginning their First Class requirement work after this date must complete the new requirement. Scouts working on First Class requirements prior to this date will have until June 30, 2006, to complete First Class rank without completing the new requirements.

The new requirement tests the candidate's persuasive communication skills and can help make Scouting available to more boys. It reads as follows:

"Tell someone who is eligible to join Boy Scouts, or an inactive Boy Scout, about your troop's activities. Invite him to a troop outing, activity, service project, or meeting. Tell him how to join, or encourage the inactive Boy Scout to become active."

The 2006 requirements book will be updated with this new information. All Scoutmasters were sent a DVD containing tools that young Scouts can use to assist them in completing this requirement. Scouts can also find support for the completion of this requirement at www.thescoutzone.org.


