The fifth Vigil Honor Candidate, joined cub scouts in 1960 and earned the Arrow of Light in 1964. Continued in Boy Scouts, earning the rank of first class. Has been active in Pack and Troop 11 of Chestnut Memorial United Methodist Church in Newport News in multiple committee positions for many years. Elected to the OA in 1960 and sealed his membership in May, 2000.

Has served as Elections Advisor for both Pamunkey Chapter and Kiskiack Chapter. Makes all the Ordeal candidates Arrows.

Will Dick Barnes guide Vigil Honor Member Lorn Zehr to the stage. Our sixth Vigil Honor Candidate began scouting in 1993 and earned the Arrow of Light in 1995. Joined Troop 6 in 1996 and earned the rank of eagle scout in 2002. Has served his unit as an patrol leader, Assist. Senior Patrol leader and currently serves as an assistant Scoutmaster in his troop. Elected to the OA in 1997 and sealed his membership in May, 1998. He served on the Kitchen Crew since 1997 and currently serves as the kitchen crew chairman for the lodge.

Will Greg Jones guide New Vigil Honor Member Phillip Carlo to the stage. Our seven Vigil Honor Candidate currently a member of Troop 30 in Suffolk. Bobby was a Vigil honor member of the Lodge and his Indian Name was Mniton Aney, meaning "maker of paths."

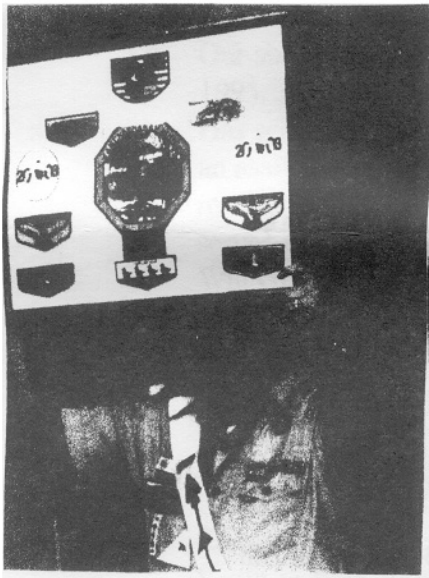
He has made the path for many young scouts and is making a path for us in Heaven.

Wahunsenakah Lodge #333
Brotherhood Evaluation Requirements**

2. Know the **Obligation** and the **Order of the Arrow song**, both of which appear below.
2. Know the **Admonition**, the **Sign of Ordeal Membership**, and the **Handclasp**. (If you do not remember them, ask a Brotherhood member either before or at the event you choose to be evaluated for Brotherhood.)
3. Remain registered in Scouting and, during a period of at least 10 months after undergoing your Ordeal, strive to fulfill your obligation by continuing and expanding your services to your own unit.
4. Remain registered in the Order of the Arrow and keep your dues paid. Be aware that acceptance of Brotherhood membership involves an obligation to the Wahunsenakah Lodge and, therefore, develop a concrete idea of how you plan to fulfill this obligation.
5. If, after at least 10 months since undergoing your Ordeal, you feel that you are meeting all of the above requirements and earnestly feel that you are prepared for the Brotherhood, you must either explain the following to the Lodge Brother who evaluates you or you must write a letter to the Lodge Membership Secretary in which you:
- Explain what you think the Obligation means;
 - Describe how you have been fulfilling this Obligation in your Troop and in your daily life, and how you have used your understanding of the traditions of the Ordeal to aid you in your service.
 - Describe the specific plans you have for rendering **service to the Wahunsenakah Lodge** in fulfillment of the new pledge you expect to take.

The above described letter should accompany your reservation and fees for the Ordeal weekend at which you wish to take your Brotherhood test and accept the additional obligation of the Brotherhood.

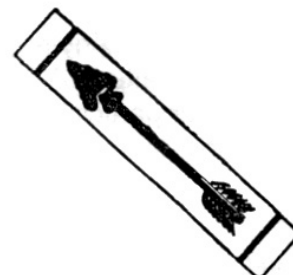

2005 Winter Ordeal

Winter Ordeal 2005 Location: The 2005 Wahunsenakah Lodge Winter Ordeal will be held at the Tidewater Boy Scout Camp Pipsico (Camp Lions area) located in Spring Grove, Virginia. Bring your own tent, sleeping bags, sheets/blanket, etc. The water has been turned off in the camp so shower facilities will not be available for the weekend. Class "A" uniforms are needed for some of the events so please remember to bring them. Work clothes will be needed on Saturday. A map showing directions to Camp Pipsico is available on the Colonial Virginia Website. There will also be signs posted at camp to assist you in finding the registration/check-in area. The majority of the work on Saturday will be performed at SKYANCHOR Ranch near Surry, Virginia. Vans, buses, cars, and pickups will be used to transport the Brothers to SKYANCHOR. **Parking:** No vehicles will be allowed into the main camping area without the expressed written permission of the Lodge Professional and/or Volunteer Adviser.

Check-in (registration) at the Ordeal: There will be signs to direct Brothers to the check-in area. Camp sites will be assigned to each Chapter. It may be necessary for more than one chapter to share a campsite. Do not proceed to a campsite until your check-in is completed.

Water: Since the water will be turned off in the main camp, it is necessary to haul water from the camp entrance area to Camp Lions for our use. Scout Leaders are requested to bring 5 gallon (or larger) water coolers and/or jugs with them to the Ordeal. Youth members should bring their canteens filled with water. The jugs should be filled prior to arriving at the Camp. Please mark each of your containers so that they can be returned to you on Sunday morning. If you will bring 5 gallon water containers, contact Alan Updike and inform him of how many you will bring.

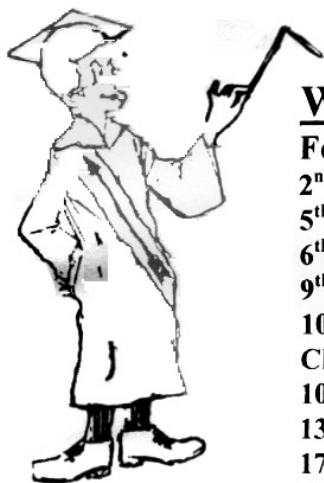

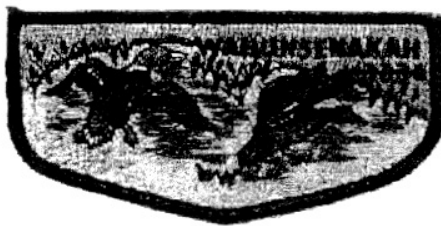
